Ranked 9th among the largest EU ports


Ranked 2nd among the largest ports on the Baltic Sea

All cargo port, including containers, automotive, liquid fuel, dry bulk, chemicals


























The activities of the Port of Gdańsk Authority S.A. include:

- 1. Property and port infrastructure management
- 2. Forecasting, programming and planning of port development
- 3. Construction, expansion, maintenance and modernisation of port infrastructure
- 4. Acquisition of property for port development
- 5. Provision of services connected with the use of port infrastructure
- 6. Assurance of access to port collection facilities for waste from vessels with the purpose of their recycling or neutralization
- 7. Coordinating the use of port infrastructure, excluding the competences of the maritime administration
- 8. Activities aimed at developing economic activities conducted in the port and promoting such activities




Port of Gdańsk – port without limitations





Transit time from/to the Port of Gdańsk






Port Gdańsk – regular weekly container connections with Finland






Alternatywny szlak północny






Port of Gdańsk - the distribution centre for Central-Eastern Europe







Land access to the Port of Gdańsk



Railway traffic





Top 10 Baltic ports 2024








Baltic Hub Container Terminal



- The largest deepwater container terminal in the Baltic
- · Designed to handle the world's largest container ships
- · 4 weekly oceanic services from the Far East and USA
- Container hub for Central-Eastern Europe and Scandinavia
- · Logistic parks operational at the back of the terminal
- Annual throughput capacity: 4.4 million TEU






Automotive terminal















Liquid fuel terminal

- Annual throughput capacity 40 million t
- Max. depth 16.5 m
- Ships up to 300,000 DWT
- 5 cargo handling stations, another one under construction
- Connected to the international pipeline system








Dry bulk terminal



- Export pier and import pier
- Annual throughput capacity 15 million t
- Loading rate: 35,000 t/24h
- Max. ship length 280 metres
- Max. depth 16.5 m






Port Gdański Eksploatacja

- Main cargo groups: coal, other bulk, general cargo, grain, ore, timber, liquid fuel



- Approx. 60 luxury cruise ship calls per year handled at three quays





PORT GDAŃSK

- Capacity: ca. 36 thousand pallets
- · Environmentally friendly warehouse cooling systems
- Specialist cold storage unit control system based on the use of mobile radio terminals
- Storage facility designed to enable the handling of all kinds of commodities which require sub-zero temperatures (fruit, vegetables, dairy products, fresh meat, frozen meat)
- · Location: inland from the Baltic Hub
- Owner: Lineage Logistics Holdings



Frozen cargo terminal



- Capacity: ca. 30 thousand pallets
- Location within the Duty Free Zone with direct access to the port quay making it possible to handle transport and fishing vessels
- Fully computerised warehouse
- Full traceability of stored commodities and optimised use of storage space
- High quality of service confirmed by quality certification: ISO 9001, MSC/ASC CoC, and IFS Logistics

T3 TERMINAL:


- An additional annual capacity of 1.5 million TEU
- New quay: length 717 m long, depth 17.5 m
- New storage yards: 36 ha
- 7 STS cranes to handle the largest container ships
- 20 RMG automated cranes
- Investment value: EUR 450 million
- · Status: completed

T5 OFFSHORE TERMINAL:

- New quay: length 800 m long, depth 17.5 m
- · New storage yards: 21 ha
- Status: under construction

FSRU terminal


- Liquefied Natural Gas reloading terminal
- Floating Storage Regasification Unit
- Regasification of 6.1 billion m³ of gas fuel per year
- Expansion of the national pipeline system by 250 km
- Floating unit will be delivered by the Japanese Mitsui group
- Planned completion date: 2028





New berth for the liquid fuel terminal

- Construction of the "W" berth for uninterrupted operations of the terminal during long-term reloading with maximum efficiency
- A new universal quay for mooring of supporting vessels, mainly tugboats
- Investment value: ca. EUR 117 million
- Planned completion date: 2028
